DISTRICT COUNCILLOR NEWS & UPDATE

By the time you read this, we will all be well into Preparations for Christmas. I hope you are all ready or nearly so.



I wish to take this opportunity to wish everyone a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. May 2018 be a good year for you.

Bin Collection Change

As I reported in the previous edition, the way paper is collected is set to change. The Council has now decided that the black paper caddies will continue to be collected up to and including Friday 8 December 2017. From Monday 11 December 2017, they will no longer be collected, and from that date, all paper should be placed directly into the blue bin.

After that date, you can use the caddy for whatever you wish at home or in the garden. If you wish to recycle, take the caddy to a recycling centre (e.g. Milton). Please do not put it in the blue bin.

I am also collecting them to return to the Council or recycle, so feel free to drop it off at my house on West Drive if that is easier for you.

Green bins collection reduces to once a month over the winter months. Next collection dates are 22 November 2017, 20 December 2017, 17 January 2018 and 14 February 2018. The black and blue bin collections remain fortnightly on alternate weeks.

Superfast Broadband for Highfields

Caldecote is supplied by two different exchanges. Highfields is connected to Madingley Exchange (in Hardwick-01954), and Old Caldecote to Comberton Exchange (01223).

Madingley Exchange won an upgrade to fibre broadband in 2011 in the Race to Infinity competition, and got the upgrade in 2013, with a combination of FTTC (Fibre to the Cabinet) and FTTP (Fibre to the Premises). Hardwick & Coton have FTTC, whilst Madingley and Highfields have FTTP.

Comberton exchange got upgraded via the County Councils BDUK Connecting Cambridgeshire Project.

Some Highfields residents still have problems getting fibre broadband ordered because BT Retail (and other suppliers) say no it is not available in the village, which is patently untrue. I went straight to the top of the BT tree and contacted the CEO, Mr Patterson to report this situation, and he assigned the task of sorting out the problems to a senior manager, who has assigned a direct contact in the BDUK delivery team in Cambridgeshire to help us sort things out.

As I have posted up on my blog and my facebook page and the Caldecote facebook group, if you are one of those who have hit the brick wall with BT (or any other supplier) and cannot order because the "computer says no",or your order abandoned, please contact me immediately by email (tumi@tumihawkins.org.uk) and provide the following information: Your Name, house number, street name, postcode, tel number, supplier, order number (if any), reason for being refused an order, and any other comment that is relevant.

Even if you have contacted me before, and sent some details, for the sake of completeness, please humour me and send it again, just so I don't miss you out.

Please pass this message on to your neighbours and friends-and those in Hardwick too. This is a chance to sort out this challenge for good (hopefully).

Planning and Development

Highfields is set to grow with the addition of two new developments 140 houses (approved at appeal for Gladmans) and 71 houses approved by planning committee for CALA Homes. We are still expecting the outcome of the Welbeck appeal for 58 houses at the end of Grafton Drive.

Works on the CALA homes site (rear of 18-28 Highfields Road) have begun with site clearance, followed by site entrance and hoarding work, and then groundworks. This part of the work is expected to be completed around 17 February 2018. The site manager is JF Lindsay, and can be reached on 01763 262950 or by email <u>jflc@btconnect.com</u>. The actual building work is expected to start mid February 2018 and last a further 2 years. The site manager for the build will be Martin Culligan from CALA, contact email <u>mculligan@cala.co.uk</u>

Work hours are 7.30am to 6pm, Mondays to Fridays and 8am to 1pm Saturdays. They should not be working on site on Sundays.

Please be careful during this development period, and impress on kids not to go into the construction site-it is not safe!

If you have reason to report any issues or see rules/conditions being breached and are not getting any joy directly with the site managers, please contact the Parish Council and/or me.

Housing

With the two new major developments happening in the village, the Council is securing 40% affordable housing, which means up to 56 on the Gladmans site, and up to 28 on the CALA homes site. Up to half of these are set aside specifically for Caldecote residents or those in need with links to the village. The rest will then be made available to the wider district as needed.

This is an opportunity for those who require affordable housing, for the first time or need a bigger property, to register with the Council on the housing needs register. Go to the council website at https://www.scambs.gov.uk/content/apply-housing. Feel free to let me know, confidentially of course, if you apply, so that I can follow up on your behalf. If you have special circumstances that need to be considered, then please talk to me about it so you don't get dismissed out of hand.

The Cambourne to Cambridge (C2C) Busway

Further to my report in the last journal edition, the C2C project by the Greater Cambridgeshire Partnership (GCP) marches on, with a new public consultation starting on 13 November 2017 titled "Better Bus Journeys: Phase One".

Please take the time to respond to the consultation. It ends on 22 January 2018.

Whilst you are considering your response to the C2C project, you may want to bear in mind the Western Orbital and its relationship to the C2C busway.

Western Orbital (WO) project

The WO, should provide a fast and reliable **bus link** near to or on the M11, between major housing sites along the A428 and the big employment areas south of the city, avoiding the busy city centre. It should join up with the C2C at M11 Junction 13 to give better bus journeys between Cambourne and Addenbrooke's, as well as access to the Trumpington Park & Ride (new or expanded). That's the idea anyway.

But at the recent LLF meeting I attended, it turns out that

(1) work on the WO is to be suspended until 2019, when the GCP expects to hear if Highways will build a Smart Motorway between Jn 11 and Jn 13 of the M11.

(2) Not only that, the work will not include the connection of the WO to the C2C, as that is viewed as a separate project. Bear in mind that the current C2C project does not even mention connection to the WO. Yet again we see our local authorities not exhibiting joined up thinking.

Draft Local Plan - Bourn Airfield Development (BAD)

The Inspector wrote to the Council at the end of October, to ask for some modifications to the draft plan. The Council has still not informed us Councillors of this letter or its content – it slipped out at a briefing meeting last week. I have written to the CEO, Head of Planning and Planning Portfolio Holder to ask them to release the letter so we can see what it says. All we know so far is the Council may have to go out to consultation before Christmas!

My concern is that the Administration continues to rely on "what the Inspector did not say or ask for as proof that their strategy of concentrating development on 3 major sites is right.

In the meantime, due to the lack of a 5-year housing land supply, speculative developments applications have now resulted in over 4,000 houses being granted planning permission across the district, 211 of these are in Caldecote. These are approvals that would otherwise not have happened but for the land supply issue. It is more than is planned on BAD, which begs the question-is BAD still needed? It would seem not!!

Putting the vulnerable at the heart of Christmas

As we begin the Christmas season in Highfields, Caldecote and Childerley, we look forward to everything we've come to associate with it – decorating Christingle oranges, singing carols in a packed and decorated church, savouring mince pies and mulled wine, and that very special feeling of gathering together on Christmas



morning itself. But there's a tinsel-like thread running through the Christmas season – and that's the perhaps surprising theme of vulnerability.

In his first Christmas sermon after his election, Pope Francis highlighted the 'vulnerability' embraced by God in choosing to become a poor human being in the baby Jesus of Nazareth, whose family became refugees while he was still a toddler. It's the story we will hear once again on Christmas Day – this year at the atmospheric stable-like chapel at Childerley. But that theme of vulnerability will be with us from the very first Sunday of December, when we make and light Christingle candles at St Michael's church. It's a national tradition that goes back over 250 years, and like thousands of churches around the country we will take a collection in aid of the Children's Society, who are committed to working step by step with vulnerable children and young people – those who feel scared, unloved and unable to cope.

Two weeks later, on Sunday 17th (the first service with our new Vicar) the theme will be picked up again in our carol service. We will sing from the traditional Bethlehem Carol Sheets, bought in aid of another charity whose focus is on the vulnerable. Embrace the Middle East's vision is to bring healing and hope to all who face poverty and injustice in the land that was home to Jesus, by supporting projects in education, healthcare and community development.

<u>For emergencies please try all numbers.</u> (If no success with any of these - for emergencies ONLY - try Sheila Stephenson on 01954 210638. Please do not leave answerphone messages for emergencies except with Sheila.)

The above co-ordinators will link you with a driver who will come and pick you up at an agreed time, take you to your destination and deliver you home. All the drivers are volunteers and are only reimbursed for their petrol. Thus for each run to Comberton or Bourn the passenger pays the driver £3.50. For runs purely within a village the passenger pays £1 to the driver. For all other runs the passenger pays the driver 30p per mile of the journey. The mileage is calculated from the driver's front door to the destination and back again. Currently when the mileage is submitted to the County Council by our treasurer (roughly every six months) Cambridgeshire County Council reimburse the drivers an additional 15p per mile for the mileage they have driven. This is one of the reasons we need plenty of drivers so that the passenger can ideally be near to where the driver lives, thus cutting costs. All drivers are DBS (originally CRB) checked at no cost to themselves.

New drivers always needed.

As the result of past publicity in the Hardwick Happenings several new drivers have come forward offering to help. This is a fantastic response and they have all now been DBS checked. We are very very grateful to them.

What we need now is a similar response for drivers from Caldecote and Dry Drayton - as stated above - to keep driver's and passenger costs as low as possible. More drivers from Hardwick are always most welcome too.

Passengers are always so grateful and your help makes things so much better for everyone.

MEMBER OF PARLIAMENT FOR SOUTH CAMBRIDGESHIRE

Welcome to my latest newsletter, lots has been happening since I last wrote! Many of you will be aware of the plans from Uttlesford District Council to create North Uttlesford Garden Community which, if permitted, could have an adverse impact on the Southern part of the constituency. As such, I attended a meeting with Hinxton, Ickleton, Duxford, Pampisford, Whittlesford and Sawston Parish Councils to discuss their concerns. I too am worried these plans may negatively impact on us by significantly increasing congestion. I have submitted my views to Uttlesford District Council and will continue to keep residents aware of developments as they occur.



You will know there are plans to reduce the number of MPs from 650 to 600, so that each constituency has a similar number of electors. On 17th October, the Boundary Commission published their revised proposed boundaries for South Cambridgeshire.

I was bitterly disappointed to read that their proposals **still** see South Cambs losing the wards of the Mordens, Bassingbourn, Melbourn and Meldreth. The Boundary Commission's report on the previous consultation acknowledged that I had put forward a counter proposal which had garnered significant public support and that most responses received generally opposed their suggestion. However, they still felt these Cambridgeshire villages should be moved to sit under a Herts regional authority, in spite of acknowledged strong local ties to the area.

I will be challenging these proposals again. If you agree that these villages should be retained in South Cambridgeshire rather than transferred to a Hertfordshire constituency, you can comment until the 11th December. Please see my website

You will remember in my last newsletter that the Department for Transport have launched a consultation on accessibility issues for disabled people using public transport. I have been working with local and national groups to bring about improvements for disabled people. BBC Look East kindly filmed a piece for me at Whittlesford station, demonstrating issues disabled people face when there is no lift connecting the platforms. South Cambs District Council have coincidentally also launched a consultation on taxi licensing which aims to provide more stringent standards. The Council is proposing to introduce a policy requiring all hackney carriages to be wheelchair accessible vehicles. This important consultation closes on 5th January 2018. You can find details here

Parliament returned in October after the conference recess, and since then, my main campaign has focused on improving the Universal Credit benefit system. I raised this issue during Prime Minister's Questions on the 11th October and the Prime Minister kindly agreed to meet with me to discuss this in more detail. There will be a further debate in the House ahead of the budget and I am optimistic the Government is listening and will reduce

the 6 week delay claimants currently experience before receiving their first payment. I thoroughly enjoyed listening to their thoughtful contributions and answering their questions. Another important part of my job is to support local enterprise in their efforts to grow and contribute to our local economy. So I was pleased to be able to open the new John Henry Group operations centre in Longstanton. This family business company has gone from strength to strength and I was delighted to be able to cut the ribbon and declare their new centre open!

Finally, Christmas is approaching (how did that happen!?) so it's time to switch on those lights! The "Light Up Cambourne" event on 25th November will start at 5pm in the Market Square, Great Cambourne, with lights on at 6.15pm. Caxton's event will be on 9th December at 5pm opposite Caxton Manor.
