District Councillor News & Update

I would like to wish you and your families a very Happy New Year 2018 and hope it will be an excellent year for you



Please note that I provide a full report to the Parish Council at its monthly meeting, so feel free to check out the meeting minutes or my blog for more details on the items discussed below.

If you have recently moved into the village, a very warm welcome to you. I hope you enjoy living here as much as I do.

Bin Collection Change Update

Black paper caddies are no longer valid for use. Please do not put excess rubbish in them as the bin men will not empty them.

According to the Council, if the blue bin is full, excess recyclable material will be collected only if placed in one transparent sack next to the blue bin. Please put any glass in your blue bin, not in the sack for safety reasons. One bundle of cardboard may be left next to your bin if it is of a size which would fit inside the bin if there were space. Please tape or tie into a bundle to assist collection. Please do not use other colour wheeled bins for your excess recycling

Crews are happy to collect recycling side waste providing they can see through the bag to confirm that the contents are recyclable. Most of the major Supermarkets stock recycling sacks that would meet this requirement.

Superfast Broadband

As I have previously reported, if you are one of those who have hit the brick wall with BT (or any other supplier) and cannot order because the "computer says no",or your order abandoned, please contact me immediately by email (tumi@tumihawkins.org.uk) and provide the following information:

Your Name, house number, street name, postcode, tel number, supplier, order number (if any), reason for being refused an order, and any other comment that is relevant. Some folks are now able to order following the first wave of reports and resolutions by BT

Planning – Grafton Drive

The Planning Inspector has allowed the appeal by Welbeck Strategic Land to build 58 additional houses on Grafton Drive. The over aching reason was the lack of 5-year housing land supply, even though he acknowledged the various limitations of the site.

Unfortunately, SCDC was negligent and did not pass on the information promptly after receiving it on 20 December 2017, until the new year when residents found it on the Inspectorate website. I immediately raised it with the CEO and Head of Planning. The CEO apologised for the admin mess up and the Planning Dept formally sent the notification afterwards.

This now brings the total of speculative developments in the village to 198. The CALA Homes site will have 71 houses built, which means Highfields is set to grow by 269 houses or about 40% in the next 5 to 10 years.

There is a lot of work ahead of us as a community to make sure that all the infrastructure "promised" by the developers and the County Council in the S106 agreements are delivered. The Parish Council will be at the fore front of this work and this is the year when the nine parish council seats are up for re-election in May. If you are interested in contributing to the well being of the community, or have skills that could be useful, why not consider applying to become a parish councillor? Draft Local Plan & Bourn Airfield Development (BAD)- New Consultation

SCDC has launched the next stage of the process for the Local Development Plan. It is a consultation on main modifications, starting on Friday 5th January 2018 and closing at 5pm on Friday 16th February 2018.

Some of those main modifications were those proposed by the Council in 2016, including extensions to the development area of Bourn Airfield, and this is of serious concern due to the effect on Highfields Caldecote, potentially directly linking the two.

The Bourn Airfield specific modifications are from SC-MM077 on page 243 to SC-MM092 on page 250 of Chapter 6 of the report,

Please comment only on the modifications, either in support of or objection to and stating reasons why. The Inspectors have asked the Council not to register any response that does not conform to this requirement. All the other issues have already been considered at the Public enquiry that took place in 2016 and 2017.

Please do take part in this consultation. Every voice counts. It is important that everyone who is concerned about this matter continues to let the Council administration know how you feel. The Council is trying to build Cambourne East by stealth! Let's make it difficult for them!

There have been over 4000 houses granted planning permission in the whole District since the draft plan was submitted, and we have 198 of those here in Highfields!!. There are more of these applications yet to be determined so could be nearer 5000 eventually. These are speculative developments directly as a result of the lack of 5-year housing land supply, for building in locations that the Council would not have considered normally had it got its act together. This means they don't need to build 3500 on Bourn Airfield anymore as I am trying to get them to admit!!

The Cambourne to Cambridge (C2C) Busway

Further to my report in the last journal edition, the C2C project by the Greater Cambridgeshire Partnership (GCP) marches on, with a new public consultation starting on 13 November 2017 titled "Better Bus Journeys: Phase One".

Please take the time to respond to the consultation. It now ends on 29 January 2018.

Whilst you are considering your response to the C2C project, you may want to bear in mind the Western Orbital and its relationship to the C2C busway.

Park & Ride (P&R) Charges to be dropped

The GCP has agreed to subsidise the removal of the charge to park at the Cambridge Park and Ride sites starting in April 2018. Since the £1 charge was introduced, use of the Park and Rides has fallen significantly.

The Board has also been asked to review opening times of the P&R sites and the bus services provided commercially by Stagecoach; in particular to meet the demand for those with early starts and those wanting to spend a late evening out in Cambridge.

Business Fraud calls

Individuals and businesses are being warned to watch out for cold calls and online contact from fraudsters who are offering victims the opportunity to apply for Government grants for an advance fee. To make the grants look legitimate fraudsters set up bogus companies and convincing looking websites that claim to be operating on behalf of the UK Government.

They then convince people to fill out online applications with personal details, apply for prepaid credit card to deposit their own contributions. Then get the card details on pretext of paying the grants into the account but never do, instead stealing the money the victim added to the card.

Please do not fall for this scam. If you receive one of these calls, hang up immediately and report it to the police.







Gateways: A Journey to Christmas and beyond

iPhone, iPad or Android? We've got news for you!

Whether you're thinking of getting married at St Michael's, or enjoy events like the Caldecote Open Gardens or perhaps you are a regular worshipper or occasional visitor, you can download for free the newly launched Caldecote Church mobile app.

What is it?

It's a free app you can download onto your mobile phone or tablet from the Apple App Store or Android's Google Play Store (just search for "Caldecote Church"). Once installed, you can tap through the menu options to contact the Vicar or Churchwarden, enjoy the photo galleries, read Sunday's sermon or just browse the latest news.

What else does it offer?

There's a calendar, so that with a tap of your phone you can check what services and events are coming up, and a resources section offers an introduction to the Bible and a 'daily prayer' feature which gives you the text for the day's Morning Prayer service, designed to be read privately to start your day well. The app will also notify you if there's a last-minute change of venue or time, for example.

What's in store?

As the app develops, we'll add more resources and information, including how to arrange a wedding or christening. We will also be gathering feedback to introduce features that you'll find most helpful, so do drop me an email (dona@dmccullagh.co.uk) with any ideas you have.



Same time, same place... From this month, we've added a service on the second Sunday of each month, which now means that there's a service every week (except fifth Sundays where they occur, when we worship with other churches in the area) in St Michael's church at 11am. Typically the format will alternate between Holy Communion (weeks one and three) and Morning Prayer (weeks two and four), and we'd be delighted to see you.

Light in the Darkness

One of the things I find hardest about living in the UK, even in the southern half, is the short days and long nights during the winter months. I find it harder to stay cheery, and long for the bright light of the sun to wake me up and to stay shining into the evening.

Getting up in the dark is perhaps the most difficult thing about it for me. I'm not exactly a morning person at the best of times, but when daylight is still an hour off and I have to drag myself out of bed I'm not fit for company. My poor wife knows it might take a while before I'm able to string sentences together in any coherent way!

In this country, and others at similar or more northerly latitudes, there have grown up a vast number of traditions that help us deal with the darker months: Halloween, Fireworks, and Christmas Lights have all helped us through since November.

Most of these have their roots in the Christian story, and virtually all have the symbol of light at their centre. The most popular church services through this time are often candle lit – beautiful warm flickering flames causing the darkness to flee.

Light is a hugely powerful and emotive symbol. Light helps us see what's around us, it lights the way ahead, it takes away fear, it helps things grow. Darkness, on the other hand, is associated with fear and with evil. Such associations were used with great effect by the Gospel writer John. He called Jesus 'the light who shines in the darkness'.

As the darkness begins to recede let us take heart. For even if it does not feel like there is much light around either personally or politically, we know light is coming. As St John so powerful put it, 'the darkness has not overcome.'

Please try to give 48 hours notice if possible and only leave an answerphone message on one phone line as otherwise it confuses co-ordinators and might mean two lifts or more get booked.

<u>For emergencies please try all numbers.</u> (If no success with any of these - for emergencies ONLY - try Sheila Stephenson on 01954 210638. Please do not leave answerphone messages for emergencies except with Sheila.)

The above co-ordinators will link you with a driver who will come and pick you up at an agreed time, take you to your destination and deliver you home. All the drivers are volunteers and are only reimbursed for their petrol. Thus for each run to Comberton or Bourn the passenger pays the driver £3.50. For all other runs the passenger pays the driver 30p per mile of the journey. The mileage is calculated from the driver's front door to the destination

and back again. Currently when the mileage is submitted to the County Council by our treasurer (roughly every six months) Cambridgeshire County Council reimburse the drivers an additional 15p per mile for the mileage they have driven. This is one of the reasons we need plenty of drivers so that the passenger can ideally be near to where the driver lives, thus cutting costs. All drivers are DBS (originally CRB) checked at no cost to themselves. **New drivers urgently needed.**

Recently three of our drivers have had to stop driving for us due to health and personal reasons. Thus we do need to appeal now for more drivers to take their place. In the past we have had a good response especially from Hardwick drivers but we now need more as it is here we have lost them from.

What we also need now however is a similar helpful response for drivers from Caldecote and Dry Drayton to keep driver's and passenger costs as low as possible. The scheme can't exist without drivers! Also everyone helping with the scheme is a volunteer, usually with their own busy lives or work, and the more volunteers we have the easier it is to match up times of lifts and nearness of pick- up places. So if you are a driver and have a little bit of spare time please do come forward. Passengers are always so grateful and your help makes things so much better for everyone.

This is my first newsletter of 2018 and I would like to begin by wishing everyone a happy and heathy new year! It was an incredibly busy end to last year and is shaping up to be more of the same in 2018!

Having recovered fully from being sawn in half(!) at the Cambourne lights switch on event, I was able to join local residents for some of their Christmas celebrations. I always enjoy carol services and this year was no exception. I joined residents in Papworth Everard ("Rudolph the Red Nosed Reindeer" a highlight for me!) for their community carol service and attended the Christmas service at Holy Trinity Church in Elsworth. I was honoured to be asked to read one of the lessons and reflected on the work local community and faith groups do to bring people together not just at Christmas, but throughout the year. Our communities are stronger because of them.

I was also pleased to be asked to record a message for "Talking News for the Blind" which is provided to about 200 blind and partially sighted people in Cambridge and surrounding



villages. This local charity does vital work to bring information and news to people who may feel isolated otherwise.

Last month, I invited Robert Halfon MP to South Cambs so he could see the excellent work undertaken at Villiers Park in Foxton.

Robert is the Chair of the House of Commons Education Select Committee and understands the role education plays in social mobility.

Villiers Park are a phenomenal education charity who actively seek out the brightest kids from the poorest backgrounds, in the

most deprived parts of the UK. They work with them over a number of years, mentoring and supporting them to achieve their potential and a place at a top University or high level apprenticeship. Back in Westminster, the Agriculture Minister George Eustice kindly agreed to meet with some of my South Cambs farmers to discuss what life might be like for them outside the EU. We all agreed it was a very worthwhile meeting and took great reassurance from George's understanding of the challenges the industry faces.

A common theme in my newsletters is my ambition to get round every school in South Cambs. First off, I took some pretty tough questions from Great and Little Shelford Primary's School Council! It was also great to be back at Cambourne Village College to hear from students who are members of CAMnesty, the Cambourne Amnesty youth group. The optimism and straightforwardness of young minds gives me a great energy boost. Finally, I visited Vine Inter-Church Primary School in Cambourne to understand the challenges facing a rapidly growing village with a constantly shifting population. The dedication of the staff and head teachers I meet in every school is humbling. It is always evident that every member of staff is completely and utterly committed to the children they teach.
