Remembrance Service on Sunday 14th November 2021


Laying of wreaths and bugler at Caldecote Peace Garden, Furlong Way, at 10.45am Followed by a remembrance service in the Village Hall.

Greater Cambridge Local Plan – First Proposals Consultation

The public consultation for the First Proposals starts on Monday 1st November 2021. The paperwork has gone through the committee stages of both SCDC and Cambridge City and amended to include comments received at those stages. Now the Councils would like to hear your thoughts, comments and suggestions. The public consultation lasts for six (6) weeks ending on 13 December. Please don't leave it till the last minute as there's lots of exciting things to get to grips with, including for the first time Green Sites to use in creating spaces for nature. https://consultations.greatercambridgeplanning.org/.

I plan to hold a workshop (online) for villages in Caldecote ward to give opportunity to ask questions and discuss any concerns or even ideas you might have. No fixed date yet but if you are interested in attending, email me and I will send you the zoom link once I settle on a date.

COVID19 Update

Covid19 is not over. Infection rates are doubling every 19 days in Peterborough and every 37 days in Cambridgeshire. Hospitals are operating at capacity in Peterborough and Addenbrookes in Cambridge. Schools in the County have been advised to return to taking precautionary measures such as wearing face coverings (not in classrooms), social distancing for teachers, and restricting visitors. South Cambs office is still closed to the public. Most staff are working from home where possible. We now hold face to face public meetings whilst observing covid safety guidelines. These meetings are streamed online on the council website and on facebook, so you can still watch and participate.

Pennies for St Michael's Church - Our Oldest Building!

WOW!!!!

At our last group count in 2019, just before the pandemic caught us, we realised the total pennies collected came to £2644.66 and we set ourselves a realistic target of collecting in £55.34 to reach £2700. Then covid set in but regardless I publicised our appeal for more pennies to reach this £2700. We still needed 5534 penny coins to achieve this! Coins did come in and I carefully saved them, but it seemed a lot to hope for, especially as shops were taking more card payments and less cash payments. Also, there was a problem as to where to count the coins – as a group round the dining room table as before or in the fresh open air in the garden?

I had them all sorted ready for counting when I was unexpectedly taken into Addenbrooke's. My daughter saw them and took them to Simon Gautrey, the Church

Treasurer, who very kindly counted them ready for banking. I could not guess at a total as the containers were expectedly heavy and well covered with pennies. But it takes 100 pennies to make £1.00!!!

Imagine my amazement when I heard from Simon that he had counted £311.55p! I also had an outstanding out of date £10 note which the bank will take and so have posted that to Simon making the total in this count £321.55.

Thus, our new total of pennies collected is:

£2644.66 + £321.55 = £2966.21

This is far far more than our target of £2700!!!! It is 32,155 extra pennies! Even more amazing we now only need £33.79 to reach the penny collection total of £3000!! More is a huge bonus. Every penny goes to maintain our village's most historic building – the Church. There are no admin costs. It is all collected and banked voluntarily.

Please do help us reach that magic total of £3000. If you are starting to think of Christmas and presents, please think of the Church!!

The Future

I have great faith we will achieve our £3000 and if so where do we go on from there. I talked to the treasurer, Simon, and both felt it was worth continuing collecting. Because Covid is still with us for the moment, coins can still come to me but I will pass them on to Simon for counting and banking. And the need for Church maintenance never ends!

So please if you are collecting pennies or other small coins - do carry on. They can be in any type of container or polythene bag - whatever!


Also, if you can be persuaded to start collecting please do. Every single penny goes to the Village Church Restoration Fund so the pennies are very gratefully received. Keeping our oldest building properly maintained is an ongoing task and we do need villagers support to achieve this. There is no other financial support from anywhere else other than the village

Wildlife Trust: West Cambridgeshire Hundreds Update, Nov 2021

Ash die-back is a fungal disease brought to the UK through imported trees and wind-blown spores from Europe. It received a lot of press a few years back so you may be forgiven for thinking the problem has been solved, but it is an ongoing and serious issue. Only ash trees are affected, but across the UK, ash makes up a large proportion of trees, and over the next few years most of these will succumb to the disease or secondary infections. Infected trees can be dangerous to fell due to the risk of falling branches, so it is good practice to manage them before they become too damaged.

All the woodland reserves in the area, owned and managed by Wildlife Trust for Beds, Cambs and Northants, have a large percentage of ash. We continue to monitor the progress of ash dieback and carry out the appropriate management (felling, thinning or leaving to provide valuable deadwood habitat). Some trees will require expensive work by specialist contractors to ensure they don't damage property or cause road accidents. We manage over 100 reserves, so the cost of this work is tens of thousands of pounds.

Here are some things that could keep you safe with the increasing risk of falling branches:

- Please show caution when considering visiting woods during windy conditions
- Please respect signs on our reserves. We may close the whole site, or part of it, if there are trees at risk of falling, or we are felling
- Please only use official entrances where we can post information regarding closures. Using unofficial entrances can damage soil and plants, create disturbance to wildlife, and compromise your safety, and that of forestry workers
- Please report fallen trees blocking or hanging above a path, including a photo if possible. They may be passable but not safe.

Find out more about ash die back on our website: www.wildlifebcn.org/ash-dieback The Wildlife Trust BCN rely on volunteers to increase the impact of our work. There are several different opportunities to help near Caldecote.

- some sites have practical work parties over the autumn and winter
- if you visit a specific reserve regularly, you could be our eyes and ears and report back problems, or help solve simple issues
- if you are a people person, you could help with community activities
- you could save amphibian lives on the spring toad patrol

The car scheme is there for anyone who needs taking to essential destinations and has no other means of transport.

Caldecote Dry Drayton and Hardwick Community Car Scheme



As many of you will know Caldecote, Dry Drayton and Hardwick all share a community car scheme which is aimed at anyone who has difficulty in getting to where they need to go. We do a lot of runs to surgeries and Addenbrooke's but there are many other places that are crucial to some of our passengers such as dentists, opticians and many many more. The scheme is run totally by volunteers and is subsidised by the County Council who pay the drivers 15p per mile driven. The passenger pays the rest directly to the driver.

With Covid this has been a difficult year. However, although a large number of our drivers had to stand down temporarily, a core kept going, and no passengers were let down. Most of our drivers are now back and two new drivers have joined us which is fantastic news.

One other great thing that has happened is, that after years of trying to find someone, a new co-ordinator has joined us - Cheryl Phillips! This job involves taking phone calls and matching up people with a driver ideally as close to them as is geographically possible. As our passenger numbers have grown to around a hundred this takes a lot of pressure off our current three co-ordinators and is a very very welcome addition to our team.

Meantime the details of the running of the scheme are the same as they have been for a long time. I know there is no obligation now, but for safety we would prefer passengers to wear masks, keep sensible distances and use sanitiser as requested. On the finance front most local runs within the three villages are costed at £3.50 return. Runs outside this area e.g. to Cambourne and Addenbrooke's are costed at 30p per mile.


