

#### Caldecote and a Right Royal Occasion

On Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> February 1952 the children attending Caldecote Primary School were enjoying a *Music and Movement* lesson on the school radio when the programme was interrupted by the sombre announcement that His Majesty King George the Sixth had passed away. Little did the 80 or so children and three teachers who heard that announcement know that a new and historic era had begun. For on that day the King's daughter, Her Royal Highness the Princess Elizabeth, ascended to the throne as Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Second, and began a reign that was to become the longest in British history. And so, this year we are celebrating Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee and her unique achievement of reigning for 70 years.

Before the Coronation of the new Queen could take place, there was a period of official mourning for the death of King George. The debt that the nation owed to the late King was not forgotten by the staff and pupils at the school. On Monday 15<sup>th</sup> February, the day of the King's funeral, Mr J. J. Davies, the Head Teacher, recorded in the school's Log Book:

The two minutes silence was observed during the morning assembly. A talk was given on the example the King's life sets us.

The Coronation of Queen Elizabeth took place in Westminster Abbey on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> June 1953 amid celebrations throughout Britain and the Commonwealth. The village school closed at the end of lessons on Monday 1<sup>st</sup> June and staff and pupils at the school were given the rest of the week off to celebrate the Coronation. Those lucky enough to have access to a television set could watch the ceremony as it was broadcast by the BBC, with a commentary provided by Richard Dimbleby. For those with no television set the commentary was also broadcast on the radio.

The week before the school closed for the holiday the School Managers, Mrs M Greenfield and Mr P Bays presented the children with Coronation souvenirs provided by the Education Committee, with spoons for the older ones, and mugs for the younger ones. Commemorative cups, saucers and plates, postage stamps, medals and other memorabilia were also widely available to buy.



Unfortunately, the weather on the day of the Coronation was not as good as it might have been for June. Cool winds and showery rain put a dampener on the proceedings, but most events went ahead, even if they had to be moved indoors. Despite the weather, activities both in and out of schools locally and around the country celebrated the occasion with

sporting events, fancy dress competitions and parties. Houses and public buildings were decorated with Union Jacks, red, white, and blue bunting, and colourful ribbons. Children made models of the gold State Coach, a replica of the real coach in which the new Queen would travel from Buckingham Palace to Westminster Abbey for the ceremony.

Sadly, there is little information about what took place in Caldecote on the day of the Coronation, but Peter Rowell, in his memoir of growing up in the village in the 1930s, recalls the Silver Jubilee of King George the Fifth and Queen Mary in 1935. This is what he wrote:

The village made a great show of decorations with union jacks everywhere. We had a village fete at the Village Hall and a fancy dress parade.

In 1953 the Cambridge Independent Press and Chronicle reported many local villages celebrated with similar events in honour of the Coronation and no doubt Caldecote did too.

In Cambridge a special Coronation service was held on Parkers Piece and over 2,500 people took part in an impressive parade across the city. In Caldecote, the regular Saturday night dance in the Village Hall was replaced by a Grand Coronation Dance, with novelty and competition dances for prizes, as well as a prize for the best fancy dress. Music was provided by Ken Newman's Band and admission was 2 shillings (10p in modern money).

So much has changed in the 70 years of the Queen's reign, the world is a very different place. But we still have much to celebrate, so let's party like it's 1953!



#### Pennies for St Michael's Church - Our Oldest Building!

#### **Success at Last!!!**

Before Christmas I explained that with a large previous collection and count, we now only needed £33.79 to reach our hoped for target of £3,000 collected in pennies and small coins. This is 3,379 pennies or small coins!

Yesterday at the end of April a friend came and we counted up the donations that had come in since just before Christmas and to our delight they equalled £37.46!!!! This means we had indeed reached our £3,000 target by £3.67! That is still 367 pennies! Even that smallish overall amount of £37.46 created a really heavy bag!

If you think about it £3000 in pennies is 300,000 pennies!!! It really is quite a feat to get this far - so an enormous thank you to all of you who have helped and donated even just a few of these 300,000 pennies. As Tesco says – Every little helps - and that is certainly true in our case!

#### The Future

So where do we go from there. I talked to the Church treasurer Simon and both of us felt it was worth continuing collecting. Coins can still come to me but I will pass them on to Simon for counting and banking. And the need for Church maintenance never ends! I will of course keep publicising reminders and special totals.

So please if you are collecting pennies or other small coins - do carry on. They can be in any type of container or polythene bag - whatever!

Also if you can be persuaded to start collecting please do. Every single penny goes to the Village Church Restoration Fund so the pennies are very gratefully received. Keeping our oldest building properly maintained is an ongoing task and we do need villagers support to achieve this. There is no other financial support from anywhere else other than the village

With much gratitude again to all of you who have collected pennies to date and a very special thank you. £3000 in small coins is an incredible feat and something we never dreamed at one stage was possible! A very big **THANK YOU** is the least we can say. The maintenance of the Church says the rest!

#### Wild Minds - Outdoor Activities for Teenagers.

This program that SCDC runs in collaboration with Cambridge Sport Lakes Trust and Wandlebury Park is now open to register for one of the three summer 2022 eight-week programmes, which start on 7, 8 and 12 June. It offers activities to support 12–17 year old's mental wellbeing though a range of outdoor activities. 

#### Wildlife Trust: West Cambridgeshire Hundreds Update, Summer 2022

We run a full programme of nature-related events for all ages across the three counties. In the West Cambs Hundreds area, I deliver family sessions during the school holidays, and guided walks for adults throughout spring, summer and autumn including three seasonal walks in Hardwick Wood, and night walks using bat detectors on Cambourne Nature Reserve. My more accessible and flexible sessions happen in Cambourne. Supporting our events gives you an opportunity to ask questions about our reserves and helps us continue to share our love of nature. Wildlife Trust BCN members get a discount on most events. This year, some short courses are funded by Comberton Adult Education and so are free to participants in return for committing to attend the sessions and filling out some paperwork.

Throughout June, our 30 Days Wild campaign encourages people to connect with nature by doing something wild every day. Free resources are available online for schools, families, care homes or individuals. You might find your children are taking part using the additional free resources I delivered to local schools. What will you do? Last year, I submitted a wildlife record for bee orchids, did some volunteering at a local nature reserve, and splashed in puddles with some toddlers.

#### General Information

As many of you will know our scheme is currently very busy. It is open to help anyone who needs taking to essential destinations within a reasonable distance and who has no other means of transport. We calculated at one point we were going to 74 different essential destinations over a year and in April this year alone drove 108 journeys to meet essential needs!

We would like to stress here - that all our drivers and co-ordinators are volunteers, each with their own family life to support. Our co-ordinators do a fantastic job and when we had need to help someone recently, who had an emergency dentist appointment, amazingly managed to find a driver within an hour – amazing!

# And here comes our first plea. We urgently need a new co-ordinator - or more if that is possible.

As you will know all the calls go to the co-ordinators who each mostly rely on a car scheme mobile phone. They then get in touch with our drivers usually by phone or email and enter the results into our personal computer system, which was designed especially for us by a young driver and is now used as our computer program; and secondly, just as important, to deal with the caller sympathetically and practically. We ask co-ordinators to join our committee which meets just twice a year so there is always background support and no waiting for solutions to problems. If you feel you could help with this vital co-ordinating role please contact Sheila, who will then be able to talk you through the initial process. All expenses are reimbursed. All problems are sorted out.

#### Our second plea is for more drivers to help out.

As you can see from the journeys covered in April, we have done a lot of miles, but we cannot afford to wear our drivers out – they all have their own busy lives to work round. Thus, we urgently need some more drivers. Currently we have about 19 active drivers, divided between Caldecote and Hardwick, but this is not nearly enough, especially when you consider that we have over 150 potential passengers wanting a journey booked!!

The driving is all done like everything else by volunteers, but the petrol/diesel is reimbursed at the current HMRC tax rate per mile, which has not changed in 20 years. Drivers get reimbursed in mileage expenses, calculated from their own front door and back again. Thus, we try and find drivers as near as possible to the passenger. Currently we have no drivers in Dry Drayton at all, although we often get asked for sometimes daily runs to hospital. All drivers need DBS checking and we can help sort that out.

Recently we have been asked who is eligible for the scheme. The answer is almost always - anyone, as long as it is for an essential purpose. At the driver's discretion, we are still asking passengers to wear masks etc. Children under 16 must always be accompanied by an adult; and occasionally adults need a chaperone too. The co-ordinator can help sort this.

Passengers pay £3.50 for a local run, i.e., the GP surgeries. Longer journeys (like Addenbrookes) are calculated on a "per mile" basis, which is calculated through our computer system, the co-ordinator will inform you of the cost. The passenger is asked to pay the driver in cash for each journey.

**Finally:** We really do urgently need this extra help with both the co- ordinating and the driving. Please, please do think if you can help in any small way. I and the team will be so grateful. The scheme has run successfully for many, many years - please help us to keep it running for a good many more.
